# Education

City of Parramatta's Education and Training sector is a \$1.2 billion industry, employing over 12,000 workers in 2017/18. It has been one of the fastest growing industries in Parramatta for employment, growing by almost 70% over the last 10 years<sup>1</sup>. Driving this is the shift towards Parramatta being crowned the new 'Education Capital' of New South Wales with the NSW Department of Education's relocation into Parramatta in 2018 bringing 1,800 jobs into the City<sup>2</sup>.

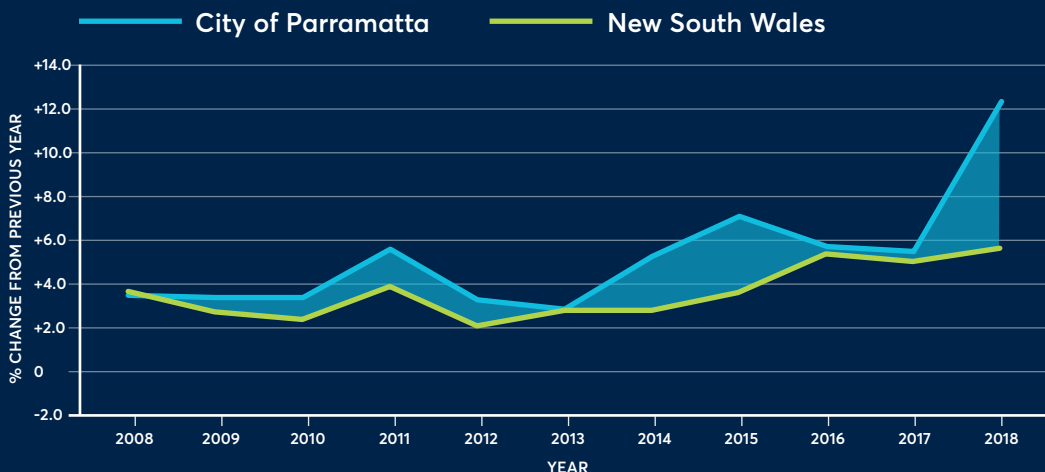

Parramatta CBD is already home to Western Sydney University (WSU) and the University of New England (UNE) campuses, representing a shift towards a modernised and integrated core of educational precincts in the heart of the City.

Leading this is the educational hub at 1 Parramatta Square which generates opportunities for collaboration and industry-focused research between WSU students, PwC and Sydney Water. The planning of future education and training precincts are set to follow this model of collaboration between industry and academia with hubs being incubated within the CBD, Rydalmere and Westmead<sup>3</sup>.
